Overview

Protecting our nation’s most critical assets from hazards—both internal and external, natural and man-made—makes the national security field a vital focus for the future. Cyber security, in particular, is one area posing complex challenges for the world today. It underpins almost every facet of modern society and provides critical support for the U.S. economy, civil infrastructure, public safety, and national security. Information technology has transformed the global economy and connected people in ways never imagined.

Responding to the needs of the national security industry, the Independent College Fund of Maryland (the I-Fund) helps develop a workforce prepared to handle the many aspects of protecting our nation through its National Security Scholars Program (NSSP). The I-Fund links students interested in serving their country with defense industry giants through the NSSP. The program provides a unique opportunity for scholars to explore a future in the field of national security and offers a road map to potential employment upon graduation.

Return on Investment

Just 10% of program donations are maintained for administrative costs—with 90% allocated directly to students.

Program Benefits for Scholars

- Paid internship opportunities with defense and intelligence industry giants
- Assistance with processing toward a valuable national security clearance
- The chance to explore a meaningful and challenging career path in national security
- Scholarships sent directly to the I-Fund member college or university for the academic year following the year in which application is submitted

Candidate Eligibility

- Must be a U.S. citizen at time of application
- Must be a full-time undergraduate attending an I-Fund member college or university
- Must be a sophomore or junior with a minimum of 24 credit hours at October application deadline
- Must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0
- Must have a career interest in the national security field
- Preferred majors include: Business • Computer Forensics • Computer Science • Cyber Security • Economics • Engineering (Software—JAVA, Cloud, Ruby-on-Rails, C, C++, C#, Computer, Electrical & Systems) • Forensic Accounting • Information Assurance • Information Systems • International Affairs/Relations/Area Studies • Mathematics • and related fields to these majors. Consideration will also be given to Accounting, Finance, History, Languages (Chinese, Persian Farsi, Russian, Korean, Arabic, Pashto, and Urdu), Liberal Arts, Physics, and Political Science
- Must submit signed application and supporting documents by deadline
- Must be available for an in-person interview on November 14 or 15 (check www.micua.org/nssp for more information)
- Must successfully complete security clearance process by May 15
- Must be willing to accept a paid summer internship with a program partner

To Apply

Application is available online at www.micua.org/nssp. Please email llivingston@micua.org of your intent to apply and submit a completed (typed and signed) original application to your campus liaison by the deadline. The following information must be submitted:

- Resume included with your application;
- 300–500 word essay (see website for details);
- Two signed letters of recommendation; and
- Certified transcript of grades.

Internships

All applicants must be willing to accept a paid summer internship, if offered. Information about housing availability is provided during the interview process.

- Internship opportunities are available with the private sector and NSA and are contingent upon national security clearance completion and approval.
- Candidates who have received approval for national security clearance are reviewed by the NSSP board for internship placement with program partners and scholarship award.

TIMELINE

November 1, 2019

Applicants notified by email regarding eligibility for an interview

November 14 & 15

Candidate face-to-face interviews scheduled

December 1

Program semi-finalists notified

January – May 15, 2020

Security clearance processing ongoing; students are notified of results

Late June/Early August

Students approved for clearance are notified of internship assignments by May 15 and of scholarship awards in early June
